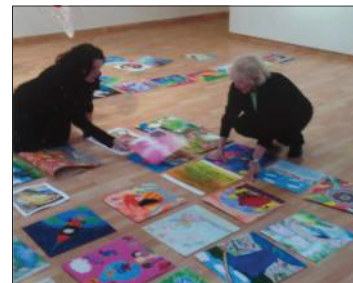
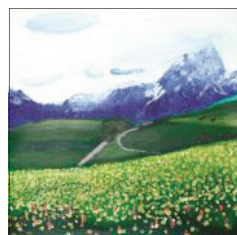




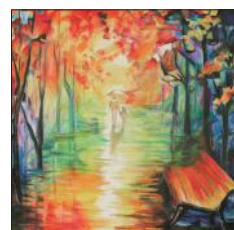
Windows To The World - Kids Helping Kids

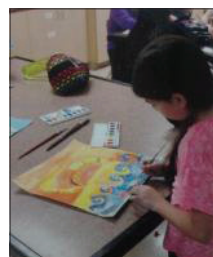

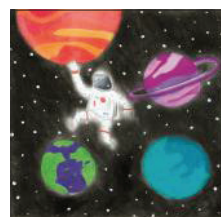
Congratulations to the 13,000 participants and our Canadian Friends!

The competition lasted for five months and during that time 13,000 entries, from coast to coast, were received.



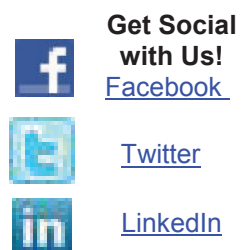
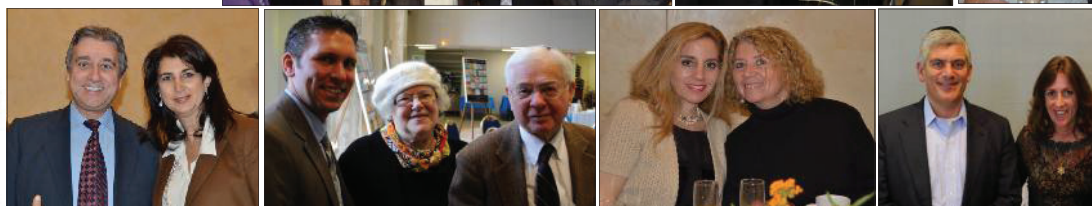
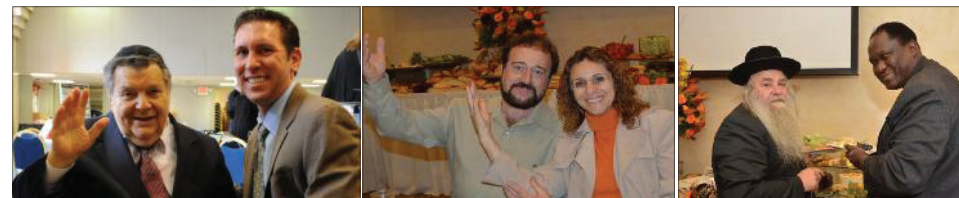

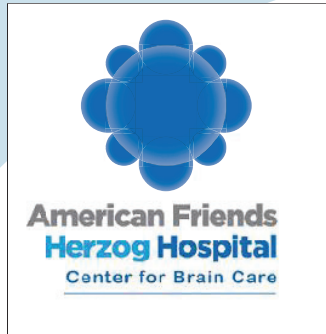

Dr. Caine, who served as the Surgeon General of the Israeli Air force, explained from a military perspective the situation that was occurring in Jerusalem.

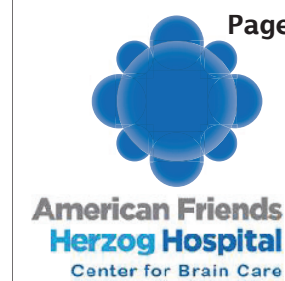
